From the Pastor's Desk

TODAY'S GOSPEL: Pentecost reminds us that Jesus' promise to bestow his Spirit upon us can be limited only by our own unwillingness to continue his mission. In the First Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul insists that we will know the Spirit to the extent that we appreciate the diversity of gifts present in our community. The Spirit of God leads us to broaden our plans and go beyond our own narrow imaginations. As we think about our celebration of Pentecost, we might do well to remember the story of how Jesus' disciples discerned that they should choose *one* man to fill out Judas' place, only to realize that the Holy Spirit had chosen more than **a hundred** men and women, empowering them all to continue Jesus' mission. This 50th day of Easter reminds us that when we are willing, the Spirit takes our best plans and multiplies them by 10 — over and again.




