From the Pastor's Desk

TODAY'S GOSPEL: Both our First and Second readings reflect on the situation of the younger son who left home and blew his father's fortune on what he thought would be the good life. The young man really did bring shame upon himself as he all but sold himself into slavery. Perhaps the humblest thing he ever said was, "I no longer deserve to be called your son." However, the real subject and message bearer of this story is the father. None of us have any claim to have earned life or any of the privileges or talents that come with our birth. Our life and our talents are free, unmerited gifts. The parable we call the *prodigal son* describes an incurably big-hearted God who knows that love can never be commanded. Rather, while love must be awaited, God responds to a little love with overwhelming, unrelenting, unrepayable generosity and joy. When we escape our focus on our own guilt or righteousness, we can "taste and see" the feast thrown by the unrelenting God who longs for us, patiently waiting to lavish us with ever more prodigal love. Then, with the help of grace, we can begin to act in the image of our relentless, ever-creative, party-loving, life-giving God.

UKRANIAN HUMANITARIAN RELIEF: Ukraine has been plunged into war after the Russian military invaded the country last week, resulting in widespread violence and a looming humanitarian crisis. In response to the request of parishioners, the Archdiocese of Toronto has launched a humanitarian relief effort to help the Ukrainian people at this time. Hundreds of thousands of Ukrainian civilians have already fled their homes and are trying to find shelter in neighbouring countries. The United Nations estimates that there could eventually be up to five million Ukrainian refugees, depending on how the war transpires. Pope Francis has called on the faithful to make Ash Wednesday (March 2, 2022) a day of prayer and fasting for peace in Ukrainian who are suffering due to this war would be a most appreciated gift.

The Archdiocese of Toronto will channel donations to support the Office for Refugees, Archdiocese of Toronto (ORAT) and the Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA). CNEWA is a papal agency with a long history of humanitarian relief; it is currently working in Eastern Europe, providing Ukrainians with food, shelter, medicine and transportation to safe locations. ORAT is Canada's largest private Sponsorship Agreement Holder, which helps bring hundreds of newcomers to our country each year; it will use donations to bring Ukrainian refugees to Canada as soon as possible.

Your donation will help Ukrainians who are beset by violence in Eastern Europe and it will help some of them find a new home in Canada.


