From the Pastor's Desk

TODAY'S GOSPEL: Each rendition of today's Gospel says that the disciples claimed they did not have enough bread to respond to the people's needs, and that Jesus asked them only to give everything they had, and that when they did so, there was more than enough. These stories foreshadow the Last Supper as they repeat the formula that Jesus took, blessed and broke the bread to satisfy the needs of the people. He taught the disciples how to give all they were, just as he did through his life and death. That was, and only that could be, enough. With both the bread and the wine, he commanded the disciples to do what he did in remembrance of him. Only Luke and Paul cite Jesus' command to do this in Jesus' memory, and St. Paul says it twice. St. Paul told the Corinthians that remembrance (in the full Jewish sense) was the key. The lesson remains valid for us today. Jesus used bread and wine to symbolize how he consecrated his entire life for us. He invites us into communion with him in that consecration. Nothing else matters.

SHARE LIFE: One of the agencies you support through Share Life is **Catholic Cross cultural Services.** "The pandemic has affected the newcomer and refugee communities we serve greatly and brought on multiple challenges to their access to much needed culturally sensitive services. **CCS** was able to ensure uninterrupted access to services, information and support for women, mental health and settlement services to those ineligible for any other services due to their immigration status." For some agencies, Share Life is the sole funder of their programs. Thanks to your support, no one is ever turned away due to inability to pay.

SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION: On March 13, 2020, Cardinal Collins issued a communication to the faithful of this archdiocese indicating that it was necessary to cancel public celebrations of the Eucharist on the coming Sunday, stating: "For this weekend and any other which my be required, I grant the faithful dispensation from their Sunday obligation". Given that most of the health and safety restrictions in our parishes are no longer in place and the faithful are able to attend the celebration of the Eucharist once again, the basis for the dispensation from the Sunday obligation has dissipated and is no longer in effect. The Church does not obligate the faithful to do the impossible. If individuals cannot attend Mass for a grave reason, including a grave vulnerability to COVID-19 or because they are self-isolating to limit the spread of illness, then they are excused from their Sunday obligation, as the law of the Church allows.
