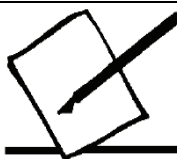

109th WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES: Sunday, September 24th is the 109th World Day of Migrants and Refugees. The theme announced by Pope Francis is "Free to Whether to Migrate or to Stray." In his message, the pope acknowledges that while the decision to migrate should always be free, in many cases it is not. Pope Francis referenced the words of the Lord when he said, "...I was a stranger and you welcomed me" reminding us that the Lord's words are a constant admonition to see in the migrant not simply a brother or sister in difficulty, but Christ himself, who knocks at our door.



From the Pastor's Desk

TODAY'S GOSPEL: Today, as we enter into the [Season of Creation](#), public figures, including Pope Francis, call our attention to climate change as "one of the principal challenges facing humanity in our day," in the words of *Laudato Si'*. We even recognize it as the [primary pro-life issue](#) of our time. Pope Francis reminds us in *Laudato Si'*, "As often occurs in periods of deep crisis which require bold decisions, we are tempted to think that what is happening is not entirely clear," but "this is the way human beings contrive to feed their self-destructive vices: trying not to see them ... delaying the important decisions and pretending that nothing will happen." In this second week of the 2023 Season of Creation, we are called to take up our vocation as creation's caretakers without delay. We must disturb the peace and implement real systemic change. It's either that or usher in the impending doom. If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts!

CELEBRATION OF THE SOLEMNITY OF ST. MICHAEL & THE CONFERRAL OF THE PALLIUM UPON ARCHBISHOP FRANCIS LEO:

Friday, September 29, 2023 – 5:30 p.m. – St. Michael Cathedral Basilica. As part of the celebration. The Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, The Most Reverend Ivan Jurkovic will confer the pallium on our archbishop, a symbol of his role as Metropolitan Archbishop of Toronto and shepherd of the faithful. 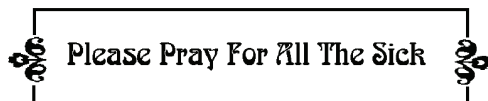
