From the Pastor's Desk

<u>TODAY'S GOSPEL:</u> When we go beneath the surface of the story, we see that even after being relieved of his debt, the first slave chose to live in a world of oppression and domination. Although the king's forgiveness had created an alternative to strict economic justice or tit-for-tat relationships, the slave rejected that option. In the middle of the <u>Season of Creation</u> (Sept. 1-Oct. 4), we might read this parable from the vantage point of being creatures given an undeserved bounty of life and possibility. None of us has done anything to deserve the life we have; it is a pure gift of God — to us and to every other part of creation. What does this suggest about the relationships we create with the rest of God's creation? God's creation is lavish. We can be, too.


