## From the Pastor's Desk

**TODAY'S GOSPEL:** Jesus tells a parable exposing the incompleteness of opposing understandings of God's will. St. Paul then invites us to take on the mind of Christ who lived and died without defending his own interests in any way. Today's reading calls us to identify honestly with one of the children and then to really listen to the other. This is the kind of dialogue Pope Francis says will create a synodal church. The Gospel is always a call to metanoia, to the change of heart and mind that opens us up to other perspectives — including God's own!

**LIFE CHAIN:** Life Chain is a prayerful and peaceful witness to the sanctity of human life and the evil of abortion. Participants pray and hold non-graphic signs with messages such as "Life, the first inalienable right" and "Abortion kills children" at hundreds of locations across North America for one hour. #### **INDIGENOUS HEALING & RECONCILIATION:** Catholics

throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto are invited to participate in the collection being held this weekend September 30/October 1, 2023 to support the Indigenous Healing and Reconciliation Fund. The collection is a national grassroots effort to assist healing and reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples of This Land. 
