From the Pastor's Desk

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time: Today's readings set a high bar for us Christian stewards, reminding us that a stewardship way of life is meant to be a challenging way of life. In the second reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, we are told to live as Christ lived. And how did Christ live? "For the sake of the joy that lay before Him He endured the cross." If we are tempted to complain about the sufferings we must endure in living as Christ's disciples, we are told, "In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood." In other words, "If you're not bleeding, what are you complaining about?" That is quite a high bar! The Gospel reading from Luke continues this challenging theme. Our Lord tells His disciples "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing." A couple of verses later Jesus adds, "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division." Jesus's life on this earth and the message He brought were not meant to simply make us feel good. In fact, His words can make us downright uncomfortable at times. That's because His Good News (and it is indeed good news!) is meant to change us, to make saints of us. The stewardship way of life sets a high bar indeed. But deeply embraced, this way of life focused on God and others will make us the saints we are called to be.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

The Christian Life

Although Jesus is the Lord of peace, Jesus never promised us that the life of a Christian disciple would be easy or peaceful. In fact in the Gospel, Jesus tells us that he comes not to bring peace, but division, to set the world on fire. The division that Jesus talks about is that which comes from the people who reject the teachings of Jesus, and the way that the Gospel will divide people who accept and reject it.

Jesus was aware that those who would follow him would face opposition from people around them. Not everyone is keen to hear the message of the Gospel, and so there will be pushback as a result. This was happening for the entire history of Israel, as we see in the first reading that even the prophets were rejected and persecuted. We see in the first reading how certain men hated Jerimiah for his teachings and sought to put him to death. If the people rejected and persecuted the prophets, Jesus Christ, and all his disciples, then we too must be ready for similar treatment.

Despite the challenges, however, we can take heart in knowing that God does not abandon those who are his disciples and are persecuted for his sake. St Paul says in the second reading to consider how much opposition Jesus endured, and to keep our eyes fixed on him when we ourselves go through the same opposition. As we live a life of stewardship, let us ensure that we make time to go to the Lord in prayer to seek his help in our own struggles. If we aren't spending time with Christ in prayer, let us make an earnest effort to spend a few minutes each day with the Lord, asking for his strength to face all opposition.

Summary: Jesus never promised us that the life of a Christian disciple would be easy, but instead, he tells us that it will be difficult for the teachings of Christ is divisive, and hard for many to accept and believe. If the people persecuted Jesus and the prophets before him, how much more will the world persecute those who believe in Christ? Although the Christian life is not meant to be easy, let us take courage knowing that Christ has faced it all first, and will strengthen us when we face opposition ourselves.


